
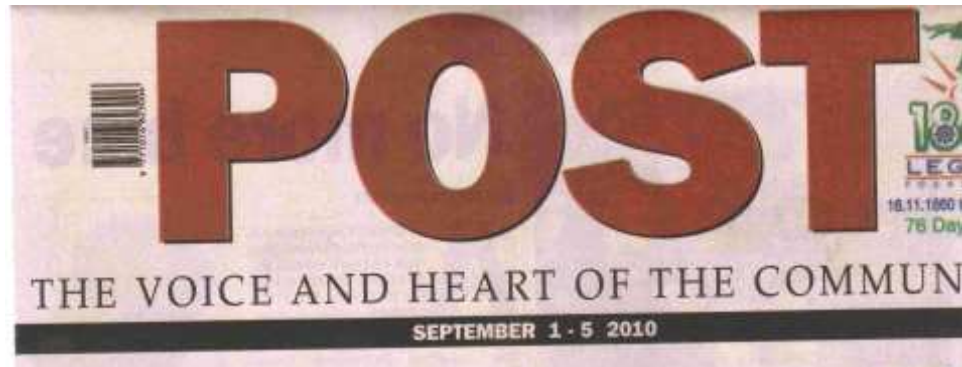

SA couple's 'first of its kind' contract
